

Camp Fire Wilani Policies

Pets

No pets of any kind are allowed at Camp Wilani.

Tobacco and Related Items

Smoking of any kind (cigarettes, pipes, etc.), chewing tobacco, vaping and similar activities are not allowed at Camp Wilani.

Alcohol and Drugs

The use of alcohol or drugs of any kind at Camp Wilani is strictly forbidden. This includes marijuana and any drug that is not prescribed to the participant.

Litter and Trash

User groups will pick up after themselves and not leave garbage of any kind on the ground, road, lake or in the facilities of Camp Wilani. "Natural" items such as sunflower seed shells, peanut shells, orange peels, apple cores, etc. are also forbidden as they attract unwanted wildlife and are unattractive. The rule of thumb is "if it doesn't grow here (Camp Wilani) it doesn't go here." Please leave no trace.

Amplified Sound

Amplified sound is not permitted, please use headphones at all times when using electronic devices to maintain the natural experience for others.

Visitors

Camp Wilani is open to pre-registered participants only. Visitors to the site are not allowed unless specifically pre-arranged with the Camp Fire Wilani Executive Director.

Vehicles in Camp

All vehicles must be parked in designated parking lots. Vehicles may be used for dropping off luggage and supplies, but must then move to and remain parked in designated lots. Use of vehicle while on camp property should be extremely limited. Vehicles must stay on established roads only, off-road travel is strictly prohibited and may result in expulsion from the property.

Speed Limit

The speed limit in camp is **15 miles per hour**. Our roads are narrow and have blind corners. There often may be wildlife, maintenance vehicles, or other hazards on the road. Failure to adhere to the posted speed limit may result in a participant being asked to leave or other consequences determined by administrative staff.

Candles, Incense, and Other Flammables

Candles, incense, fireworks, and other flammables are not allowed in cabins, or anywhere else on camp property. We encourage the use of battery-operated candles, LED lights, and other such replacements as needed.

Damage to Property

Registered guests are responsible for any damage to property including natural areas, buildings, trails, structures, equipment, facilities, and program supplies caused by their party and the primary adult will be billed for repair or replacement.
